VILLAGE OF OTISVILLE ORDINANCE NO. 87

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS TO INVESTIGATE THE NEED FOR LIMITATIONS ON OFF-STREET PARKING AND TO MAKE RULES WITH REGARD TO SUCH PARKING AND TO PLACE SIGNS GIVING NOTICE OF SUCH LIMITATIONS

Section 1. The Director of Public Works shall be responsible for the regulation of the parking of motor vehicles on street right-of-ways within the Village limits.

Section 2. Before instituting restrictions on such parking the Director of Public Works shall make a determination that such restrictions are needed and shall determine the types of restrictions that are needed and in making such determinations he shall take into consideration the following factors:

- 1. The amount and nature of the traffic on the street in question;
- 2. The number and capability of pedestrians in the area;
- 3. The availability of sidewalks in the area;
- 4. The amount of space available for such parking:
- 5. The availability of parking alternatives in the area in question;
- 6. Special considerations, such as but not limited to snow and leaf removal, public events, business hours, school hours, etc.

Section 3. At such time as the Director of Public Works has determined the need for such restrictions, he shall make recommendations to the Village Council which may, by resolution, authorize the Director to place signs at appropriate locations in the areas in question which set forth any and all such restrictions. These signs shall be of such a size and of such a nature that they will clearly inform the public as to the nature and extent of such restrictions.

Section 4. At such time as such signs have been posted, it shall be unlawful for any person to park a motor vehicle upon any street right-of-way in such a manner, at such time or for such period as shall violate the restrictions set forth.

Section 5. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof before a court of competent jurisdiction be punished by a fine not exceeding One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, or imprisonment in the Village lockup or the County Jail of Genesee County, for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court who shall try such offender.
