

VILLAGE OF OTISVILLE
EXHIBITS AND SHOWS
Ordinance No. 10

An Ordinance relative to Exhibitions and Shows.

SECTION 1:

That it shall not be lawful for any itinerant person, persons or company, to make within the corporate limits of said Village any public exhibitions of natural or artificial curiosities, or any caravan, circus, menagerie, theatrical impersonation, concert, musical entertainment, exhibition of common showman, or show of any kind, without first obtaining a license therefore as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 2:

The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to issue a license in the name of the Village Council to any person, persons or company, to make any one of such public exhibitions as foresaid, on the payment in advance to the Village Treasurer of the sum prescribed in the next section.

SECTION 3:

SECTION 4:

It shall be the duty of any person, person, or company receiving any such license to keep good order in and about his or their place of exhibition, and not permit in or about such place of exhibition any gaming or any disorderly conduct.

SECTION 5:

Any violation of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$600.00 dollars and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment not to exceed 90 days, or both such fine and imprisonment.
