VILLAGE OF OTISVILLE OBSTRUCTION OF SIDEWALKS Ordinance No. 15

An Ordinance relative to the care, use, and obstruction of side and crosswalks.

SECTION 1:

That no person or persons shall obstruct any side or crosswalk in said Village in any manner.

SECTION 2:

No person or persons shall construct, place or maintain any awning, sign, merchandise, wood, coal or any other article, substance or material of any kind, on, over or above any such sidewalk within seven feet of the same, except so far as may be necessary in transporting such articles across, and then due care shall be exercised not to obstruct such walk or interfere with public travel. This Ordinance shall not apply to any steps as now constructed in part of any building, or to prohibit any merchant or mechanic from displaying goods, wares and merchandise kept by him for sale in front of his or their building and not occupying more than two feet of such sidewalk next adjacent to said building.

SECTION 3:

No person shall lead, ride or drive any horse, cattle, mule or other animal upon any sidewalk in said Village, or permit, leave, have or place, any horse, cattle, sleigh, wagon or other animal or vehicle, to obstruct any side or cross walk in said Village.

SECTION 4:

No person shall ride any bicycle on any sidewalk in said Village, or do any coasting with wagon or sleight of any kind thereof.

SECTION 5:

The Village Police shall enforce the provisions of this Ordinance, and if any side or crosswalk is obstructed, remove or cause to be removed forthwith such obstructions.

SECTION 6:

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not to exceed twenty-five dollars and costs of prosecution, and in default of the payment of such fine and costs, be imprisoned not to exceed thirty days; unless such fine and costs are sooner paid.
